Understand Yourself Relative to Others... Myers Briggs Assessment:

The **Myers-Briggs Type Indicator** (**MBTI**) assessment is a psychometric questionnaire designed to measure psychological preferences in how people perceive the world and make decisions. These preferences were extrapolated from the typological theories proposed by Carl Gustav Jung and first published in his 1921 book *Psychological Types* (English edition, 1923). Jung's typological model regards psychological type as similar to left or right handedness: individuals are either born with, or develop, certain preferred ways of thinking and acting.

It's only when you understand your own personality can you then understand the inherent bias in your own perception of yourself and you decision making processes. You accept the premise that you are different from those around you. Once you understand your own unique temperament, you begin to perceive how you impact others. You learn to speculate about another's personality type and adapt your communication style to relate better to your intended audience or listener. This will be an important skill when it comes time to see patients but especially important when you come face to face with an interviewing faculty member.
